What Will You Experience in Today's Worship?

Singing

Most notice we sing without an instrument. God specified that we use the instrument He created--the human voice and human heart. He desires the pure expression of worship. In our desire to serve Him according to His expressed will, we sing without any instrumental accompaniment.

The Lord's Supper

Each week, we gather to keep the saving sacrifice of Jesus fresh in our minds and our lives in the Lord's Supper, following the example of the early church (Acts 20:7). The bread without yeast symbolizes Christ's physical body and grape juice mirrors His blood given for sin. In this service, we remember our freedom from sin and our anticipation of heaven.

Contributions

We give of our physical means each week as an expression of our gratitude for God's blessing but also to acknowledge our role as stewards of the wealth God has provided. With the money collected, we spread God's message and help those in need. All contributions are free-will, and no one is obligated to give.

Preaching

We connect with God's will through listening to his voice, the Bible. Our sermons come from God's Word. Through them, we learn, are strengthened, and are encouraged.

How do doctors do with the counsel they dispense?

Listen to an internist from California:

We are quite adept at knowing what is wrong with someone else. We can offer advice on what to do and not do. When it comes to ourselves, we come up woefully short.

When you read the Bible, don’t search it to discover what’s wrong with “them.” Look into the eternal mirror and ask, “what’s missing in me?” More importantly, confront the issue, “what does God want me to do?” and then do it.

The world will ignore glib advice given by a know-it-all. They pay attention to a flawed person who is trying to live truthfully.

How well can you take your own advice?



Encountering Hinduism: 2nd Annual Outreach Workshop

On March 24 and 25, Waterview will host our 2nd Annual Outreach Workshop for Churches of Christ.

Our speaker for the weekend is Dr. Mani Pagidipalli (M.D., D. Min) evangelist for Mission India Outreach.
