
Join us as we bring God’s Word to bear on current issues and questions.

PRAY FOR NICARAGUA

We talk much about Nicaragua at Waterview. We feed children each week and teach them the Bible.

Yet, the country is currently in crisis. Starting in early May, the government issued various orders which resulted in demonstrations. The leaders called out the army and over 70 were shot in the streets.

This past Wednesday, more demonstrations were held to remember the mothers who lost children in the previous bloodshed and another 10 were killed.

So far, those who work with the programs are safe. However, food shortages exist and, due to safety concerns, some of the breakfast programs has been postponed on some weeks.

We continue to support the work of the gospel in Managua and ask for your prayers on behalf of those we are helping.
