THE COURSE

College students know the routine. They choose courses to get them through their studies.

Some courses reveal more than a narrow field of study.

At Yale University, the most popular course is PSYCH 157. It doesn't sound appealing until you read the description: "Psychology and the Good Life."

The short version is "what does it take to be happy."

There is a good reason it is the most popular offering. In 2013, more than half of the students sought mental health care at the university clinic.

Laurie Santos, the professor, teaches that common ingredients of a happy life—grades, jobs, money—never brings happiness. "Our intuitions about what will make us happy, like winning the lottery and getting a good grade, are totally wrong."

No one needs to go to Yale to discover that. It is a foundational spiritual truth. Happiness is not what you have but who you are.

People can be miserable millionaires or satisfied paupers. It's not life's stuff that brings inner joy. Happiness comes from knowing what is essential and living for things greater than self.

That's why Paul could write from a prison cell, suffering from unjust imprisonment,

*Rejoice in the Lord always; again I will say, rejoice.
Let your reasonableness be known to everyone.
The Lord is at hand; (Philippians 4:4–5)*

You don't need a \$100,000 college degree to give you happiness. It's a gift that only God gives to those who seek it.
