THE TABLE

Sara Harmeyer never envisioned what life would become when she quit her job as a fundraiser.

In 2012, Harmeyer realized her happiest year was when she ran a cafe out of her home. She thought it was about feeding neighbors. Then she invited 300 people on Nextdoor's website, and 90 came.

She discovered that people want to be invited.

Since that time she hosted more than 3000 people. From it, sprang the idea for Neighbor's Table which now has tables in 28 states. Her goal is to have at least 1 table in each state in 2 years.

She personally delivered the \$1,700 red cedar tables to individuals, businesses, and churches. In many places, she attends the first meal.

Sara observes, "Most people getting our tables want to be part of what we're doing and want to be part of something bigger than themselves."

A common table offers uncommon connections. All want to be invited. As Jesus left the earth, he decided to form his fellowship around the common table. On it, he placed bread and a cup. He opens the door to the world and says, "I'd like for you to be part of my table." His invitation went to rabbis and tax collectors, Gentiles and Jews.

Those who respond to the invitation sit at a big table together spanning the globe and the centuries.

After all, as Sara noticed, when you are sitting at a big table, you feel like you are part of something.

Today, we gather around a table because Christ makes us part of something grand.
