THE OPEN DOOR

Jaret Hucks put out the welcome sign...in an unusual way.

Flood waters from recent hurricanes drove people from their homes. One of the hard-hit areas was Myrtle Beach, S. C.

Hucks told people, "Come stay with me. Come stay at my house until you can go back to yours." His house is the Midtown Inn and Cottages.

It wasn't an invitation to a night in a hotel. It was an offer of generosity. Hucks provided 1,000 nights of shelter to some of the poorest in the area who had nowhere else to go.

Many times "love your neighbor" is a theoretical concept. Jesus knew a concrete answer. He asked the lawyer in Luke 10, "who is your neighbor?" The lawyer wanted to give a legal answer, but Jesus painted him into a practical corner. When you give mercy, you are the neighbor to the one we "love" as neighbor.

It cost Jaret Hucks about \$50,000 to help people who had nothing else. The truth is it did not cost him but enriched him in ways no accountant can measure.

Whenever you give hope to someone who has none, you hang a "welcome sign" in your life. What's your sign?
